FOREWORD

Quite by chance I saw part of a spelling program on ABC TV the other night. I had watched an episode of Van Der Valk, went away to do something else, and when I returned a series called "Guy Mont Spelling Bee" was showing.

Now this was not your usual spelling bee with young high achievers displaying their skill, but was quite quirky, with four stand-up comedians having a go at spelling while being humorous, which I suppose was the point rather than the spelling.

Stand-up comedians need to be good and witty with words, but have no need to spell them, and in fact two of the panel were good spellers and two were appalling, probably average for the general community.

As a young lad at school, spelling was regarded as important but I feel this is no longer so as I recall one of my children being told by a teacher that when writing it was important that a reader understood what you wrote rather than the minor detail of spelling correctly.

I remember being tested at school when I was about 8 years old and given verbally of a series of words to spell. I still recall vividly that I made one mistake; putting an "n" in "restaurateur".

My father was a ferociously good speller. He told me of a weekly spelling competitions when he was at school where the whole class stood up and the teacher asked pupils to spell a word, which if they got wrong they sat down. The winner was the "last man standing", and was often him.

My view is that good spellers are usually avid readers because if you read a lot you've probably read most of the words you need to spell and if you see a word that's spelt incorrectly it stands out to you like a beacon.

So if you want to spell well, it's good to read a lot, and regularly. It can be a wonderful joyous experience, so why not? If you have children, encourage them to read, read to them, and let them see you reading to set an example.
