

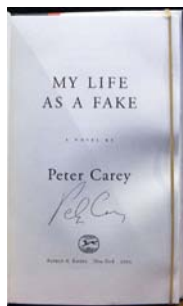

This is signed by Ted Matthews (Nov 1896 - Dec 1997) who on his death at 101, was the last living Australian veteran of the Gallipoli landing.* \$75



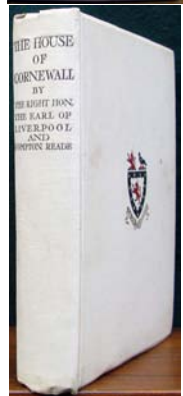

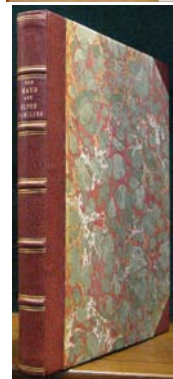
