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## FOREWORD

Among other things, the publishing world seems to be coming to terms with AI, as are many in other areas of activity.

I hear Hachette has just withdrawn a novel over suspected AI content, and while this may be a first, I'm sure it will be a more frequent occurrence as writers seek to use ChatGPT and other AI tools to write what they would have previously created using their own ideas and resources. Apparently there are tools to detect when text has been written using AI, but perhaps in time AI will be smart enough to write content that cannot be identified as AI-written.

Also, it is said that Penguin Random House has filed a lawsuit against OpenAI, alleging its chatbot ChatGPT violated copyright by mimicking and reproducing the content of a series of German children's books.

And the The New York Times has stopped using a freelance journalist to write book reviews after discovering he used AI to help write a book review that contained elements of a review of the same book in the Guardian. Though maybe he was just plagiarising parts of the Guardian review. Either way, it could be considered unprofessional.

Craig Munro is a very experienced editor, having worked with many of Australia's great writers and I recently read his book "Under Cover, Adventures in the World of Editing" and was amused that he revealed the occurrence of a typo in the 1975 first hardcover edition of "Poor Fellow My Country". Instead of "The moon peered over the trees" that first printing reads "The moon peed over the trees". I'd be surprised that given the size of the book, Australia's longest novel, there was only one typo, but I'll take his word for it. I read it when it was released but life's too short to read it again.
